
























































































What does being an ally to LGBTQ+ communities mean?

An ally is someone who feels touched or concerned by the realities of LGBTQ+ communities and who will mobilize themself for their cause. Anyone can be an ally including people from sexual and gender diversity. For example, a cisgender lesbian woman can be an ally in the trans community. Allies can set up projects or events to combat discrimination and oppressions affecting members of LGBTQ+ communities, or even raise public awareness of these realities. Allies play an important role in the fight against homophobic and transphobic bullying in schools. They can support their LGBTQ+ peers by educating themselves on these realities, as well as by opposing the mockery and violent behavior they witness.

How to be an ally and properly support your LGBTQ+ classmates?

Listening skills and humility is essential when engaging with LGBTQ+ communities. Here are some important behaviors to adopt to become a better ally:

- Learn about the different realities of LGBTQ+ communities
- Challenge your own opinions and prejudices about LGBTQ+ people
- Listen to LGBTQ+ people around you to find out how to best support them
- Show your support as an ally and act as a role model
- Respond to bullying situations when you witness them
- Encourage your school to create a safer environment and adopt good practices yourself
